

At a glance

In May 2023 the Haute Autorité de Santé announced that the assessment of predictive, diagnostic and prognostic technologies represent 80% of all assessments of professional acts for reimbursement. This warrants establishment of a separate group with specific skills and its own assessment criteria. The group is already operational and has conducted several assessments.

Already working

The CEDiag was already established in 2022 and carried out several assessments. Two of them were discussed at the meeting on 18 April 2023:



ASTHMA

Measurement of expired fraction of nitric oxide (FeNO) for the adjustment of asthma treatments



COVID

Interest of availability rapid antigen tests (TROD) COVID/flu and COVID/flu/RSV in the community pharmacy setting.

Objective

Centralise the assessment of diagnostic, predictive and prognostic tests, and feed into decision making of the other assessment groups within HAS. Develop assessment criteria and methodology by December 2023.

Remit

- Assessment of diagnostic, predictive and prognostic tests for the purpose of reimbursement, and supervision of products used in the health system. This includes any artificial intelligence-based technologies.
- Input to the CT, CNEDiMTS and CEESP (see below)

Composition

The committee has 21 members with backgrounds including genetic medicine or nuclear medicine.

Apart from its core mission the CEDiag committee will provide input:
